Why choose Cheltenham Bournside Sixth Form?

Choosing the right sixth form is an important step in preparing for future success. By choosing us, you can be confident you will be supported and challenged to excel, both personally and academically, within a strong community environment. 2022/23 is our 50th Anniversary Year; that's a landmark we are very proud of.

Wide course choice

With 38 A level, BTEC and vocational courses to choose from, we offer the widest range of options available locally. From Mandarin to Media Studies, Psychology to Photography and brand new courses in Applied Science, Criminology and German, studying with us means you can pick the best combination of courses to suit your interests and future aspirations.

New pathways

We invest a significant amount of time in ensuring that each student is well suited to their subjects, and to enable this, we offer three clear pathways, including A levels, BTECs or a mixture of the two, designed to help you select subjects with a clear route to your university, further study or career goals.

1 Studying 3 or 4 A levels

Entry criteria is at least a grade 4 in Mathematics and English Language or Literature and at least a grade 5 in your three/four chosen subjects at A level.

Studying 3 BTEC courses

Entry criteria is at least a grade 4 in Mathematics and English Language or Literature and at least a grade 4 in three related GCSEs.

3 Studying a combination of A levels and BTECs

Entry criteria is at least a grade 4 in Mathematics and English Language or Literature and a bespoke offer of grade 4s and grade 5s depending on examination results.

Expert teachers

Our teachers are experts in their fields, providing high-quality teaching and support to give you the academic focus you need to succeed.

Dedicated space

We develop and invest in outstanding facilities and resources to enable our students to be the best they can be. Sixth form students enjoy their own space and benefits within the school, including private study areas, a large sixth form common room, and a brand-new cafe.

Private study areas provide focused working environments whilst the Pitstop Cafe provides a vibrant social space for students to work and socialise outside of the classroom, much like the professional spaces students will find at university or in the workplace in the future.

Specialist facilities

Sixth form students of course benefit from the excellent resources and facilities across the whole school too. Our scale and space means that students benefit from specialist facilities across all A level and vocational options. This includes our modern well-used library, our new state-of-the-art Alan Turing Maths Hub and our large drama studio and music rooms.

To complement our rich sports provision, we have updated our fantastic AstroTurf and created a brand new gym facility, in addition to our tennis and badminton courts, athletics track, sports field and three sports halls.











Support and wellbeing









Nurturing support

We recognise that students thrive when they feel nurtured and supported as well as academically challenged. The two years of sixth form can be a demanding time for students and we are always on hand to provide support.

Dedicated leads for both academic and pastoral support within the sixth form are here to help. We pride ourselves on supporting you to develop mature lines of communication with your tutors and teachers, working together to overcome any challenges you may face during your studies.

Academic challenge

You will be clear on your academic progress and goals. You will receive three reports per year and undertake mock exams at the end of Year 12 and in Year 13 to ensure you are prepared for your final exams. Parents and guardians will be invited in to discuss your progress each year too, alongside receiving a regular Sixth Form Parent Bulletin and invitations to a host of drama performances, music concerts, and sporting events.

Our school dog, Lottie

Lottie, our school welfare dog, plays an important and popular role in our pastoral team. On-site every day, Lottie reminds us to be present in the moment and to prioritise our mental health and well-being. Lottie recently featured as the main character in an award-winning Young Enterprise project too!

Enrichment opportunities

Whether your passion lies in sport, art, drama, music, or the academic side of life, beyond the classroom we offer an unrivaled range of opportunities to broaden your experience, have fun, and to develop personal leadership skills. You have the opportunity to take part in a diverse mix of enrichment opportunities alongside your studies as part of your timetable, encompassing the Early Applicant Scheme, Duke of Edinburgh Gold Award, Young Enterprise, the Arts Award, Cyber challenges, and charity and community volunteering.

As our most senior students, you are given a higher level of responsibility and greater flexibility to study in a way that suits you. As a student in Year 12 or 13, this sense of autonomy empowers you to develop your skills of organisation, communication, and research.





Mentoring and leadership

Opportunities for mentoring and leadership can be found throughout the school. We are proud of our long-standing positive reputation for sport and run a thriving Athlete Development Programme (ADP) which offers a full calendar of sports fixtures where sixth form students both play for and help to manage, the top teams in the school.

Our senior students set a positive example across the school on a daily basis, demonstrating leadership and commitment to learning through our active and rewarding House System which is at the heart of our school. 12 senior house captains are appointed each year, and every student, from Year 7 through to 13, belongs to one of our six houses, bringing together students of all ages to use their perseverance, skills and talent to earn house points.

Results and destinations

Bournside students go on to secure places across a range of leading universities, degree-level apprenticeships, higher education courses and employment options. Over 90% of students secure places on their first-choice university or higher education course.

Record-breaking results

In 2022 our students achieved record-breaking results. An amazing 11% of A levels were A*s, 17% of students gained three or more A levels at grade A and A*, and 45% gained three or more A levels at grade B and above. The average grade gained was a B. Please visit our website for a full breakdown of results.

Destinations include Aberystwyth, Bath, Bristol, Birmingham, Brighton, Exeter, Derby, Gloucestershire, Hull, Keele, Kingston, Leicester, Leeds, London, Loughborough, Manchester, Nottingham, Oxford, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Reading, Sheffield, Southampton, Swansea, UWE, Worcester and York.

Students have gone on to study a broad range of subjects, including Astrophysics and Space Science, Business Management, Biotechnology and Microbiology, Criminology, Chemistry, Economics, English, Film Production, Geography, Illustration, International Relations and Politics, Law, Medicine, Medieval Studies, Midwifery, Occupational Therapy, Pharmaceutical Science, Physics, Primary and Early Years Education, Psychology, Sociology, Spanish, Sport Rehabilitation and Zoology.
