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A Look Back at 2021-22

2021-22 has been another exciting, action-packed year for Cheltenham Education Partnership (CEP). Since September 2021, all partnership members have been determined to return to some form of pre-covid normality in which staff and students from across the partnership have again been able to meet and collaborate in person. Whilst activities from previous years have continued, we've seen a number of new CEP activities introduced in recent months, including:

We have been delighted to collaborate with a number of the partnerships 'supporting partners' through many of these projects, highlighting the strength of the Cheltenham community and passion for supporting the educational experience of its young people.

In total our 11 CEP schools have participated in over 115 hours of 'in-person' collaborative events and activities this year. Additionally, there have been a number of virtual activities and competitions. CEP events and activities have given opportunities to 1,039 staff and students. This has included 40 ChangeMakers staff and student leads, 130 participants in the ChangeMakers Summit, 30 Student Voice representatives, 80 students' interest in Cyber taster sessions, 24 Latin students, 150 debate enthusiasts, and more.... The theme was an extension to the first Chelt 4 Change event which previously covered the broad subject of 'inequality'. Students opened the event with each school taking it in turns to present their views on educational inequalities and how businesses can support them towards achieving their career aspirations.

Presentations were followed by a live panel Q&A with guest panellists Councillor Flo Clucas (Liberal Democrat councillor in Cheltenham and Cabinet Member for Safety and Communities), Richard Gibson (Cheltenham Borough Council, Strategy & Engagement Manager), Lindsey Holland (Cheltenham Chamber Commerce), and Anjie Winter (G-First LEP, Enterprise Coordinator).

Cheltenham Education Partnership was delighted to collaborate with the University of Gloucestershire (UOG) Sustainability Team and UOG School of Education for the ChangeMakers Summit on 17th June. Drawing on the universities expertise in Education for Sustainability (EfS), over 130 teachers and students from 10 CEP schools were taken on an incredible learning journey through a series of sustainability inspired workshops to help empower young people with the knowledge, skills and means to effect change in their schools and local community.

Each of the schools presented an exhibition of their imaginative sustainability projects developed since the project launched. The event also provided an innovative learning space with guests from a range of industries, including Cheltenham Borough Council, Stagecoach, Golden Valley Development, Interface, Hillside Environmental, Planet Cheltenham, and Baxter Storey, so that students could share ideas and discuss how sustainability will feature in future careers.
