


Thread Counts Workshops

CEP is offering students the opportunity to participate in this project that will address issues around fashion consumption in the context of school uniform. Hosted by the University of Gloucestershire, in these workshops' students will be challenged to design and make wearable fashion items from used/second-hand school uniforms. This project is ideal for pupils who are passionate about fashion and/or sustainability. The project will run over the course of 3 activity days, where pupils will gain an understanding of issues surrounding fashion consumption, the impact fashion has on the environment and an understanding of the life cycle of a school uniform. Additionally, all pupils will gain a variety of skills such as up cycling and/or repurposing school uniforms, teamwork, leadership, creativity, technical sewing and drawing skills for example.

Cheltenham Festivals - Science for Schools


