Events and opportunities



<u>Insight</u> into <u>Bristol</u> - <u>Year</u> 12
This <u>Summer School</u> is a free experience for students from Black, Asian and ethnic minority

This <u>Summer School</u> is a free experience for students from Black, Asian and ethnic minority backgrounds to find out what it's really like to study at the University. Students will be able to attend live seminars with academics, meet current Bristol students, enjoy social events and get advice on applying to university. Participants will then be eligible for either a guaranteed contextual offer or guaranteed interview from the University of Bristol. Applications close on **Tuesday 23 March**. <u>Visit our website to apply</u>.

The Destinations Conference - Year 12

This <u>conference</u> is running on the **13th April 2021** and will be presented in collaboration with the University of Bristol's African and Caribbean Society (ACS.) It is aimed at students who identify as Black African; Black Caribbean; any other Black background; or any mixed ethnic background featuring one of these groups. Students will be able to choose between a range of subject streams as well as receiving information from current students and the ACS. Explore Events - Year 12




Work Experience - Life Sciences

The Faculty of Life Sciences offers a range of virtual and physical <u>work experience</u> that allow year 10 and 12 students to build self-confidence, gain an understanding and develop essential work and networking skills. They will gain a deeper understanding of some scientific theories, techniques and equipment that different subject use and get to see or do scientific experiments.

Science for Life Interactive Virtual Roadshow
