Clarification of where to find resources and information

- All of the resources for your child's learning will be made available on Showbie; these include Zoom codes for the lessons and lesson resources. Showbie is also where students will upload work for the teacher's consideration;
- We very much welcome parents' involvement in their child's learning. If you would like to access resources in order to help your child you will need to use his or her login details.
- Classcharts information about your child's timetable and behaviour; this has separate levels of access for pupils and parents, each of whom have separate login details.
- Messages sent via Schoolcomms will appear as an email in your inbox (for example, this is how you received this letter).
- Letters sent home can be accessed from <u>here</u> on our school website.

Being prepared for remote learning

Please can we ask parents / carers to ensure that your child / children are fully prepared for their lessons each day. This preparation includes having, ready to use:

- Pens variety of colours for excellent note taking
- Pencils

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- Ruler
- Maths equipment, including calculator
- Ruler
- Highlighters
- Exercise book / sketch book / note taking paper etc.

We would also like to encourage students to have switched on their camera as this improves the online learning experience of the class and makes things easier for the teacher. However, this is not a requirement: just a request! Finally, the students must have their name as their Zoom name as they enter the lesson – if they do not have their name, they won't be allowed access to the lesson. All Zoom links will be found in their class Showbie area – if any student is having an issue with this then please email your class teacher and they will be able to rectify the issue.

We are relaunching the popular 'Enriching Home Learning' site that we created during the initial lockdown last March. This site is accessible on the students' home Frog page. Here they will find a variety of activities to support their mental health and well-being, allow access to fun competitions and generally provide them enrichment opportunities to support their home learning. We will also update this site weekly with an assembly, student notices and advertise any House events that they can access from home.

Year 11 Resource Collection – Monday 18th January

An email has been sent to parents / carers of Year 11 students, as well as to the student's school email account explaining that they may be invited to come into school on Monday to pick up resources from the Drama Studio that are needed for them to continue learning from home effectively. If your child has resources to be collected, they will have been contacted via their school email and / or class Showbie account by their subject teacher informing them that there are resources to be collected.

Please ask your child to come to school to collect their resources from the Drama Studio as follows:

Surnames **A - H:** 9.00am - 9.30am Surnames **I - P:** 9.30am - 10.00am Surnames **Q - Z:** 10:00am - 10:30am

It is our view that the student's journey to school is an essential one if we are to deliver a high-quality learning experience to these exam group students.

Assessment and exams

We have not yet received any additional information about how GCSE and A'level grades will be awarded this year. The Secretary of State for Education and Ofqual have committed to opening a consultation on these issues within the next few days and we will, of course, contribute to this.

However, to repeat what I said in last week's letter: because GCSE and A'level results will largely be determined by teacher assessment, failing to engage in remote learning or failing to submit work requested will impact upon the final grade awarded.

Your feedback

As students have now completed 10 days of remote learning during lockdown 3, we would love to receive your feedback to help us improve the quality of our remote provision. As such, please could you complete this <u>Remote Learning Survey</u> by Tuesday 19 January. It should only take a few minutes to answer.

We have sent a separate survey to students via their school email address. We would be grateful

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if you can encourage your son or daughter to complete this.
