

## Music at GCSE and A-level

Music at GCSE is designed for students who enjoy playing and listening to different kinds of music. This course can lead on to two options at Sixth Form.

Music A-level - You do not need to be a performer to choose this course, but an enjoyment of music and a willingness to compose music are a must.

Music Technology A-level - During this course you will develop and apply theory and practical skills through learning how to produce your own music in Logic Pro, how to record live instruments and understand studio roles.

# Music degrees and apprenticeships

With outstanding talent as a singer, songwriter, dancer or musician you may be able to enter the music industry directly - whereas if you're interested in business, educational or technical music-related jobs you'll likely need a qualification.
