What a week! Activities Week 2024 was our biggest one yet, with more than 100 trips and events taking place for students in Year 7 - 10 and in Year 12.

Students climbed aboard coaches to travel to the Black Country Museum, Legoland and Warwick Castle. On Activity Choice days students chose their days out at local venues and further afield, including Drayton Manor (new), The Wave, Sandford Lido, Hollywood Bowl, China Town in London, Planet Ice, Croft Farm and 270 climbing.

In school, we held Art sessions, staged Crimonology crime scenes, took part in PE challenges and games and collaborated with Andy 'Dice' Davies from the brilliant Cheltenham Paint Festival for the third year running to create more fantastic outside murals in the Art and Music Quad,

Year 7 and 8 enjoyed STEM days, supported by incredible local businesses, including Cyber First and Northrop Grumman, whilst students in Year 10 explored Kohler Mira, the impressive international brand with its Head Office in Cheltenham.

And that is not all! Year 7 students spent 4 days in Lille, practising their language skills whilst exploring French markets and art museums, 40+ students took on the white water rapids in the Ardeches, our Gold DofE students hiked in the French Alps and our brilliant Year 9 students enjoyed camping in the Mendips for 4 nights.
