# **Work Experience**

#### Why do we offer students the opportunity for work experience?

Work experience helps a student learn about industries they are interested and gives the student an opportunity to find out if they are suited to that industry or not. Work experience also provides students with examples to write about in future applications, and for some sectors (e.g. education, medicine and veterinary science), admissions and recruiting staff will expect to see relevant work experience on your application.

#### When do we offer students the opportunity for work experience?

- Year 10 ALL Year 10s will complete work experience **14th 18th July 2025**.
- Year 12 Year 12s have two opportunities for work experience:
  - At the end of Year 12, 14th 18th July 2025 (last week of term)
  - At the start of Year 13, 1st 5th September 2025 (first week of term)
