



Microsoft also delivered an insightful talk on AI, discussing how tools like Co-Pilot and ChatGPT work, their vulnerabilities, and the ethical risks associated with AI. The students were deeply involved in the activities and had the opportunity to network with various companies, freely asking questions to industry professionals. Many students shared that they now feel inspired to pursue computer-related courses, highlighting how problem-solving in tech can support their future careers across various fields.
