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

Year 12 – STEM Experience

The Nuffield Research Placements programme is for year 12 students interested in finding out a bit more about what it is like to work in a STEM based organisation during the school/college summer holidays.

For several years Bath University have worked with a large government organisation in Cheltenham, who have run face to face placements for students. These placements are 4 weeks long and include a strong element of teaching programming/coding skills, and then using these to apply to real world problems in the workplace. Thus, the experience gives a real taster of work, and in a highly prestigious organisation. Students are extremely well supported and looked after by the professional HR team on site, and each has their own mentor.

Student must be British.

Year 12 students studying at least one STEM subject at post 16 (A levels, level 3 BTEC, IB) At least 5 GCSEs at level 6 or above to include maths, science and a written subject

Ideally meets the Nuffield bursary criteria - ONE of the points below:

- Eligible for free school meals
- Household income under £30,000
- Has ever been in care
- Eligible for sixth form bursary payments

Students eligible for a bursary will receive £300 on completion of the placement. All travel costs for all students will be covered by Nuffield.
