Student Q&A with playwright, Dougie Blaxland

Mr Clarke, Teacher of English, organised a video call last week with playwright, Dougie Blaxland. Blaxland has written a musical drama called "Our Little Hour" which has been on at the Everyman Theatre this week.

The play concerns the real-life story of Walter Tull, who was both the first black player to play professional football in Britain, but also the first black officer to be appointed in the British Army. Tragically, Walter was killed in action in WW1.

"Dougie was so impressed with our Year 9s and the questions that they asked, that he gifted Year 9 students ten free tickets for each of the performances this week. A wonderful opportunity."

"There are clear links to the Year 9 English curriculum because two of the class readers this year are based on black culture, and it also fits with War Poetry later in Term 5. The title of the play comes from a poem called "But A Short Time to Live", by Leslie Coulsen, who was also killed in the trenches. We are grateful to Dougie for both his time with the students and the generous donation of tickets." - Mr Clarke, Teacher of English




Chelsea's story


They will be choosing their free books by Thursday, 17th October, but they have until half term to enter the competition. So, why not have a go!
