Congratulations to Blake and Josh in Year 7 who placed 2nd and 3rd in the **U12 West Midlands Cyclocross League**, and were presented with their trophys last weekend.

This league is extremely competitive, especially in their age category, and is a huge commitment as it covers 11 weeks of races, across the West Midlands, on most Sunday mornings between September and December 2024. They ended up on the same number of points (882), and were only able to be separated on the last race result.

They now move onto different cycling seasons, with Blake concentrating on road racing, and Josh on mountain biking, 4 Cross and road racing, from now until the end of August. From September they will begin racing Cyclocross again as U14's, which also means they can begin competing in National races.




