Covid 19 updates

Covid precautions

It is no longer a legal requirement to stay at home if you have covid. However, the <u>advice</u> remains unchanged: if you have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 or a positive test result, the public health advice is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.

Of course, the symptoms of covid are very general and it may be difficult to distinguish between covid and many other infections or illnesses which have similar symptoms. Therefore, although it is no longer necessary to test twice a week, we suggest that your child self-administers a test if you suspect they have covid. We have a number of tests available so if you do not have any at home, your child can obtain a new pack from their house areas or from the school's business centre.

If your child tests positive they should remain at home in line with the current guidance. On the first day, they should access online resources, including <u>Oak Academy</u>. For subsequent days, they will be emailed appropriate work to help them keep up to date with their learning.

If your child tests negative, providing they are well enough to do so, they should come to school in the normal way.

If your child is too ill to come to school due to illness (covid or anything else), they should stay at home. If they are well enough, they could access work via Showbie, their exercise books, <u>GCSE Pod</u>, the <u>Oak Academy</u> or other online resources but, in general, if a child is too ill to come to school they are likely to be too ill to complete school work.
