Opportunities outside of the classroom

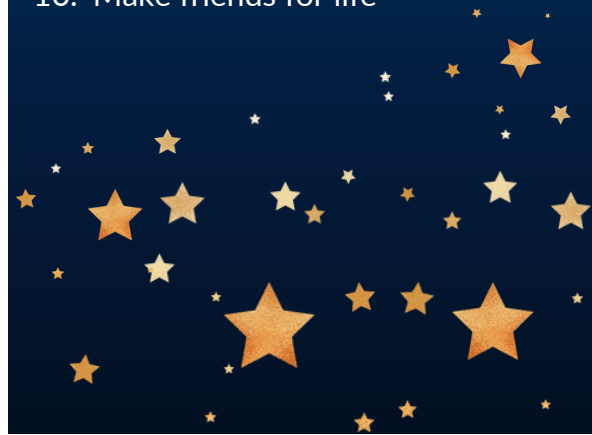

10 top tips for a successful transition


Moving up to secondary school is a big change for your child, and for the whole family! Talking to your child about what to expect ahead of starting and helping them to get organised can really help. Here are 10 top tips to set everyone up for success.


 Sign up to MyChildatSchool and ClassCharts. Be aware of their subject and homework timetables.


 Allocate time for homework each night. Provide support, encouragement, and assistance.


 How are they travelling to school? Encourage them to test their route over the summer. If walking, can they comfortably carry their bags? If cycling, do they have a secure bike lock and helmet? If taking the bus, encourage them to get to the bus stop in plenty of time and wait in a mature safe manner.


 Establish a morning and evening routine that suits your household. Emptying bags and repacking each evening. Getting ready in good time and eating well each morning. Reassure them and support them in developing organisational skills.


 Layout their uniform. Is it clearly named, clean and ready? Please ensure each item is labelled with their full name and tutor group - it is not unusual for items to get lost, so this is essential!

 Talk about and encourage participation in clubs and activities. There is a fantastic co-curricular offer at Cheltenham Bournside School, and it can help to make friends and develop confidence and new skills outside of the classroom.

 Check their school bag and planners each evening – do they have their 'Magnificent 7' ready and know their timetable?

 Over time, encourage them to be more independent in all these areas and celebrate steps forward in this.

 Remind your child to ask for help when unsure, to look out for others and to be kind and helpful. We are proud of our supportive school community, where we respect and care about each other and believe in equality and kindness.

Recent good news

Junior mathematical challenge success



Over 250,000 students across the UK sat the Junior Maths Challenge on Wednesday 27th April. The 60-minute multiple-choice challenge is designed to stimulate mathematical problem solving, encouraging students to use mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency.

To recognise the highest performers the top 50% of participants receive Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates in the ratio 3:2:1.

Over 50 Year 7 and 8 students from Cheltenham Bournside School took part in the challenge, achieving Gold, Silver and Bronze certificates.
